The Hagan Scholarship is a need-based merit scholarship for goal-driven students in the high school graduating class. We would like to award 1,200 new four-year scholarships for the upcoming 2026 - 2027 academic year in college. It is not unusual to award multiple scholarships to students attending the same school. Scholarship Criteria

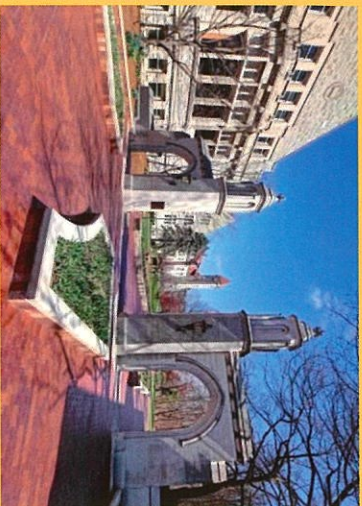
- Must attend a high school located in the U.S.
- Eligible students can apply regardless of nationality or citizenship.
- Must have achieved an unweighted 3.5 CGPA based on a 4.0 Grading Scale.
- Must enroll in a four-year college or university, in the 2026 fall semester.
- FAFSA information is not required to apply.
- Must work 240 hours from January 1, 2026, to September 1, 2026.
- Award recipients will receive \$2,000 to purchase essential items for college.
- Award recipients will be eligible to receive up to \$7,500 each semester.
- After graduation from college, recipients can apply for a Hagan Graduate Scholarship.
- Parents 2024 Adjusted Gross Income must not have exceeded \$100,000.
- The Application Deadline is December 1, 2025.
- Scholarships will be awarded in April 2026.

Fall Application / Award Timeline

For the 2026-2027 Academic Year in College

1. The Scholarship Application can be downloaded from the HSF website after September 1, 2025.
2. The Application Submittal Deadline is December 1, 2025.
3. Applications reviewed for eligibility and compliance with instructions.
4. Applicants notified of their status.
5. Finalists provide supplemental information.
6. Scholarships awarded in April, 2026.

Eligibility Requirements

1. Must attend a high school located in the U.S.
2. Eligible high schools include public, private, charter, magnet, and STEM schools.
3. Students can apply regardless of nationality or citizenship.
4. Must have achieved a 3.50 CGPA.
5. Must enroll in a four-year college or university the fall semester following high school graduation.
6. Must maintain a four year or less graduation schedule.
7. If awarded a scholarship, must work 240 hours from January 1, 2026 to September 1, 2026.
- Employment must be regularly schedule work performed under supervision for compensation.
8. Parents 2024 Adjusted Gross Household Income must not have exceeded \$100,000.
9. FAFSA information is not required to apply.
- Finalists must provide FASA information.
10. Must apply for Federal and State grants if eligible.

Hagan Scholarship 2026-2027 Academic Year

The Hagan Scholarship is a nationwide need-based merit scholarship. Designed for goal-driven students in the high school graduating class. The scholarship provides recipients with the opportunity to graduate college debt-free.

The scholarship provides up to \$7,500 each semester for up to eight consecutive semesters. Hagan Scholars have attended 774 colleges and universities located in all 50 states and the District of Columbia.

Recipients who graduate college while in the Hagan Scholarship Program can apply for a Hagan Graduate Scholarship.

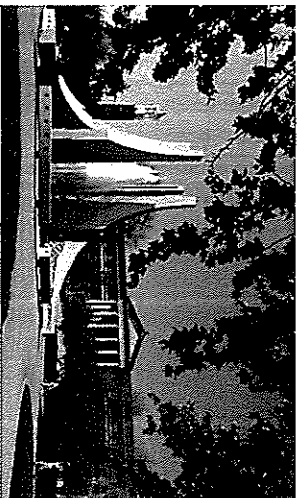
Free Workshops, Free Brokerage Accounts, and Free Study Abroad provide recipients with a practical understanding of important life skills not typically covered in the school curriculum.

Purpose

The Purpose of the Hagan Scholarship is to provide each recipient with the opportunity to obtain a four-year college education and graduate debt-free. And, to provide each recipient with a practical understanding of important life skills not typically covered in the school curriculum.



Purdue University

Recipient Responsibilities

1. Must maintain a 3.25 CGPA and a four year or less graduation schedule.
2. Must earn fourteen credit hours each semester and thirty credit hours each academic year excluding summer school.
3. Graduate students must maintain a 3.50 CGPA and maintain their approved Graduation Schedule.

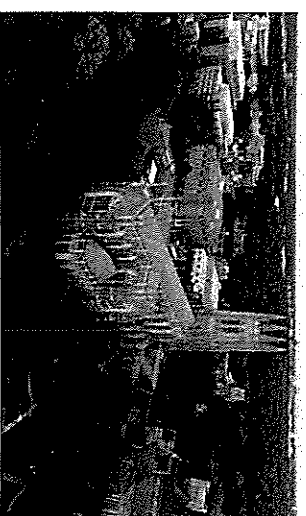
To be fair to all recipients we will not make exceptions to the Scholarship Criteria or to Deadlines.

Scholarship Particulars

1. The scholarship disbursement amount, up to \$7,500 each semester, will be determined by HSF by taking the Total Cost of Attendance including tuition, fees, room, board, books, supplies, personal and transportation costs; then deducting the total dollar amount of ALL scholarships, awards, grants, waivers, Federal and institution provided work study, and one-half of recipient's FAFSA SAL. Parents are not required to pay the SAL, it is used only to determine the disbursement amount.
2. The disbursement amount will be adjusted each semester to offset the expiration or loss of other scholarships, awards, grants, waivers, Federal or institution work-study, and changes in the recipient's FAFSA SAL.
3. The scholarship is renewable for up to seven additional consecutive semesters if the recipient fulfills the scholarship criteria and mandatory workshop responsibilities.
4. First year recipients receive \$2,000 prior to college enrollment to purchase essential items for college not covered by the scholarship; computer, printer, cell phone, clothing, office supplies, etc.
5. Second year recipients will be provided with an HSF Schwab Brokerage Account to manage until graduation. HSF funds managed by each recipient will be \$10,000 the second year, \$15,000 the third year, and \$20,000 the fourth year.
6. Third year recipients who achieve a 3.50 CGPA are eligible for an all-expense paid study and travel abroad experience worth up to \$8,000 or the funds can be used to study abroad for one semester.
7. Recipients must work 240 hours from January 1, until September 1, prior to the start of each academic year in college. Work must be regularly scheduled employment performed under supervision for compensation.
8. Recipients graduating college while in the Hagan Scholarship Program can apply for a Hagan Graduate Scholarship, good for up to four additional consecutive semesters receiving up to \$7,500 each semester.
9. There is no application fee or processing fee.

5,594 scholarships have been awarded to date.

How much is the Hagan Scholarship worth?

1. Undergraduate Scholarship: Up to \$60,000.
2. Graduate Scholarship: Up to \$30,000.

Other Benefits, Regardless of Financial Need:

1. Free Workshops to learn important life skills.
2. First Year: \$2,000 to purchase essential items for college.
3. Second Year: \$100 to establish a Personal Schwab Brokerage Account. \$10,000 HSF Schwab Account to manage.
4. Third Year: \$15,000 HSF Schwab Account to manage. Up to \$8,000 to Study/Travel abroad.
5. Fourth Year: \$20,000 HSF Schwab Account to manage.
6. Graduation: Recipients will receive all gains in their managed HSF Schwab Accounts up to \$10,000, and a Graduation Package including a Certificate of Achievement. Walnut Plaques will also be awarded for exceptional achievement.

Is this a need-based or merit-based scholarship?
BOTH. Applicants must authenticate genuine financial need in order to attend college. Recipients are selected based upon academic ability, personal goals, and achievements in and out of school.

Why do you have mandatory workshops?

To help recipients obtain a practical understanding of important life skills not typically covered in the school curriculum.

Why are recipients required to work?

The Grantor worked during high school and college and believes each recipient will personally benefit by contributing to the cost of his or her education.
