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| <p>The Canton Area School District will provide remediation and enrichment opportunities for all students within the Canton Area School District. Due to limited resources in a rural, remote area of Pennsylvania, we believe that by providing remediation and enrichment opportunities for all students, we can achieve our vision of being Focused on Learning, Every Child, Every Day, the Warrior Way!</p> |

| Expectations for Teaching and Learning |
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| <p>All students in grades K-12 will be provided with enrichment and remediation opportunities effective March 26, 2020, through the end of the school year. Our teachers will be required to create a Google Site page and provide informal activities to reinforce or extend prior learning. Teachers will hold office hours for approximately 6 hours every day where they can be doing informal “check-in” with all students in their classes. Students who do not have access to the internet or do not have technology devices will be receiving their enrichment and remediation through paper based packets that will be created by grade level and content area by teachers. Because of inability to provide access to all students to the current grade level skills that they have not learned, we will be unable to ever reach option 3, which provides students with remote instructional opportunities.</p> |

| Communication Tools and Strategies |
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| <p>Where can parents find information about our school during this time?</p> |

Parents receive “all calls” sent out by administrative teams. They can visit teacher Google sites through visiting our webpage, under the “Schools” tab, and then find the appropriate school building staff directory. Staff will be communicating through phone calls and online applications that mirror tools they use when students are physically at school (Class Dojo, etc.). Parents will also be able to email their teachers during this time should they have any questions or concerns about their child. We will also be updating the Coronavirus section of our website as new updates are provided by the state to our district.

What tools and resources will be used to provide enrichment and remediation?

The district will continue to use the online educational platforms that we have been using through the entire school year. You can contact your teacher if you have any questions about our online platforms. Teachers will be able to use the Zoom applications to virtually meet with students. Some teachers may choose to use Google Voice as a way to communicate with parents. Also, some of our staff will be using their personal cell phones to communicate. Please understand that during this time, you may be receiving calls that show up on Caller ID as “No Caller ID.” These calls may be coming from the personal cell phone of your teacher and are an attempt to do a social “check-in” on your child.

Are there planned times when teachers will be available?

Each teacher will have planned office hours that go from 8 AM – 2 PM. Teachers will do their best to get back to your needs in a timely fashion. Please be patient with them as they work through this new type of educational environment. Please understand that if you have questions or concerns about content your child is working through, still communicate those concerns (even if they are outside office hours) and the teacher will be sure to get back to you at their earliest convenience to address those needs.

Where can parents find updates from teachers and administration?

The teachers will be providing updates on their Google Sites page. The administration will continue to use the “all call” system, email, social media (Twitter and Facebook), and the website to post any major announcements.

Access (Devices, Platforms, Handouts)

Where can enrichment and remediation opportunities, parent communications, work time availability be found?

All enrichment and remediation opportunities, parent communications, and work time availability for teachers can be found on individual teacher Google Slides pages. If you do not have internet access, your enrichment and remediation opportunities can be found through paper packets that will be mailed to your home address. Students without internet access will receive support through landline and cell phone calls from faculty and administration.

Staff General Expectations

High School Teacher Expectations:

Communication

- Utilize various forms of communication to connect with students and parent/guardian where necessary daily (email, social media, Zoom, phone, etc.). Encourage responses from students within that daily communication.
- Refer to the shared document CHS Student List (Without Internet Access) to identify students who do not have internet access and that you have on your rosters (and those that haven't answered the survey as of yet)
**Continue to update the CHS students without internet access file shared with you by turning those red names to white when you confirm an online communication or not.
- Refer to the shared document titled CHS Student List (Communication). On Thursday (4/2) of next week, please go through the list and "turn" the student name green for all students that you feel are connected and engaged in your communication with them and/OR learning activities. If the student name is already green, simply leave it green and go on to the others. This will then create a list of students who we aren't "reaching" and we can use our other resources like Guidance, FNH counseling, myself and Special Education department to reach them
- Utilize Zoom as your communication platform to interact with colleagues and team members (and staff meetings upon request)
- Setup a google site for your class and send the link to Deanna. This will be placed on our district homepage for all students to visit. The expectation is for this website to be updated frequently with activities. Be sure to share it with the public so sign in is not required. (Please edit your google site so that the access is public. The default when you create it only allows those within our cantonwarriors.org group (staff and students) to access but not parents outside of it. Instruction & Assessment

- Student attendance is not required and learning activities will not be graded-these flexible instruction days do not count as student days but do fulfill your teacher contractual obligations
- Avoid providing new content and ONLY reinforce/remediate/enrich previously covered content
- Grades for the third marking period will be a reflection of what was completed and submitted as of 3/13/20 at 3:30pm. Third marking period grades will be due in csiu on 4/3/20 at 3:30pm. This will need some flexibility and zeros in the grade book should be exempt. No 4th marking grades until/if we return
- Develop and complete learning packets for students that do not have online access (see CHS Student List (Without Internet Access)), send the material necessary for copying to Dani. She will make copies, create the packet and mail from the district office

- Utilize what you have been using to provide the online learning programs for students. This may be google classroom, google hangout or anything else that you are familiar with. The PAIU will be providing online tools for you to also use.
- Our Student Learning Leader team has created a list of low prep time, high engagement activities that you could use if you are looking for some "out of the box" methods of communication with students, as well as, engagement in learning activities. Please try something new, innovative and “come out of your comfort zone” to engage our students. This document has been shared with you and titled Quick and Awesome Learning Ideas from CHS. Feel free to add your activities to this list, as well
- Learning support teachers will be monitoring their caseloads and providing support for the various activities

Elementary School Teacher Expectations:

- Create a Google Site to communicate work with students. This Site will be on the district website for students to access. Teachers will set up a google site for your class and send the link to Deanna. This will be placed on our district homepage for all students to visit. The expectation is for this website to be updated frequently with activities. Be sure to share it with the public so sign in is not required. (Please edit your google site so that the access is public. The default when you create it only allows those within our cantonwarriors.org group (staff and students) to access but not parents outside of it. - Any student without internet/device accessibility will be sent packets of work from teachers. All K students will be sent packets to aid in the educational enrichment process. Teachers will identify students without internet/device and give this list of students to the principal. They will contact all parents/students to determine if packets need to be mailed home.
- Each grade level team of teachers will create a packet of activities that will be mailed to students without internet/device access.

- Teachers will utilize various forms of communication to connect with students and parents/guardians where necessary daily (email, social media, Zoom, phone, etc.).
 - Learning support teachers will be monitoring their caseloads and providing support for the various activities
 - Learning support teachers and Title I teachers will be monitoring their caseloads and providing support for the various activities
 - The supplemental learning support teacher will create packets for all of her students to be mailed home.
 - Teachers will utilize Zoom as your communication platform to interact with colleagues and team members (and staff meetings upon request)
 - Teachers will not teach any new materials. Only material that has already been taught will be reviewed with students.
 - Teachers will utilize what you have been using to provide the online learning programs for students. This may be google classroom, google hangout or anything else that you are familiar with. The PAIU will be providing online tools for you to also use.
 - Grades for the third marking period will be a reflection of what was completed and submitted as of 3/13/20 at 3:30pm. Third marking period grades will be due in csiu on 4/3/20 at 3:30pm. Student Expectations

- Connect on-line with your teachers/complete work sent home via mail.
- If you do not have internet access, work through remediation and enrichment activities provided by your teacher via “paper and pencil tasks.”

- All content will be found on the individual teachers Google Site page which can be found on our CASD district webpage.
- Teachers will be available for office hours daily. If students have questions about work, they can call, email, or set up virtual options to communicate with teachers during this time.

Attendance / Accountability

Canton Area School District will use an asynchronous approach to providing virtual education to our students. Students will be allowed to enter the Google Site of their teacher 24 hours a day. We will not be officially tracking attendance of our students; however, as teachers check in with their students and speak with them about their progress through specific activities, they will be able to determine a level of engagement of each student within the content they have shared. Meaningful participation will be determined through packet completion of students who do not have internet and through informal conversations and communications between the teacher, students, and their parents. The Canton Area School District, as long as they are in Option #2, will not be grading any content for its students.

Good Faith Efforts for Access and Equity for All Students

The Canton Area School District has surveyed all students and staff about internet and technology. After attaining the results of these surveys, the district allocated resources to teachers to ensure they were able to engage in this process. We have created paper packets for students without internet access. We have re-allocated our special education and Title services so they are strategically aligned with the students who need the greatest support. They will also be moving forward with all compliance issues around special education procedures and processes. Because we will never be able to deploy the technology resources to all students, we will never, as a district, be able to enter option three for any of our students.

Special Education Supports

Special education teachers and their supervisor are currently and will be planning annual review meetings for each IEP Team. The parents of all students with disabilities will be receiving communication from the special education department. This communication will talk about how the district will attempt to meet as many of the needs and supports as outlined by each child's IEP. We have re-allocated our resources and the deployment of these resources. If parents have questions or concerns, they will have the email address/phone numbers of their teachers and the supervisor of the department.

EL Supports

Currently, the Canton Area School District has one K EL student. That student/parent will be contacted by the student's teacher and a packet will also be mailed home. The EL teacher will also contact the student/parent and provide support.

Gifted Education

The Gifted students will continue to receive enrichment opportunities through our contracted gifted support teacher through our local Intermediate Unit. The gifted support teacher will have a Google site to provide her contact information on, and the students and parents can communicate with her through those means.
