#### Superintendent

Dr. Amy Martell, Superintendent, reported on the following items:

- We are always looking for new and creative ways to maintain a positive public image at the Canton Area School District. Having a channel for communication and seeking new ways to communicate effectively is a goal of the district in the 2022/2023 school year. There has been an increase in student spotlights in various media platforms such as the Canton Independent Sentinel, district website, and district social media outlets. The staff at CASD have developed a plan to increase communication between the school and the community as part of the 2022/2023 school year goals. Dr. Martell and Mr. Jacopetti will be meeting with the Homepage Network this week in hopes of providing additional opportunities for programs (chorus, band, agriculture, among others), teachers, and students to have spotlights in the local community. We once had an active Interact Club and there were highlights about the special things going on in the district in a news format for the school and community to enjoy and still watch today. Our goal is to start small and continue to move forward.
- The CHS fall athletics were very exciting in the 2022/2023 school year. Our volleyball team ended their season as the runner up in the District 4 championship against Galeton. The cross country team had many season successes. Camille McRoberts represented CHS in the state championship. Our football team will play on Saturday against the Muncy Indians for the district championship. A special thank you to our band and cheerleaders for their enthusiastic support of all of our teams.

- We have had multiple career visits during the school day and that has allowed students to learn more about post-secondary career options.
- The career fair in the high school gymnasium was well attended. Thank you to Barb Knapp for her hard work to make this event a success. The career fair brought in several businesses to talk about what options students have in their post-secondary careers.
- In the month of October, the students in grades 10-12 completed ASVAB testing as a means for identifying potential careers in the military and PSAT in preparation for post-secondary education options.
- The PBIS Family Night was well attended with about 150 people. The PBIS first marking period assemblies also took place.
- A book study is starting in the elementary school with a group of seven teachers.
- Four elementary school teachers will be attending the PBIS conference in Hershey to accept our recognition as a PBIS Tier I and Tier II program.
- Upcoming events at the elementary school: parent-teacher conferences are taking place on November 10 and November 11, 2022; sixth grade grandparent luncheon will be taking place on November 17, 2022; elementary band and chorus concert is December 1, 2022.
- Updated the board on elementary school enrollment.
- Dr. Martell has been reviewing the comprehensive plan and the district goals. Our comprehensive planning process begins this fall with a review of the "Ready, Set, Go!" sections of the plan. That means that we need to review and refine what makes us the Canton Area School District with focus on our vision, mission, and values. This also means that the administration is beginning to pull together the data needed to continue to make decisions that will impact learning for all of the students in the district. In the high school, we have been meeting weekly with English, Mathematics, and Science teachers to begin looking into our curriculum. This work is something that we should be looking at systematically on a continual basis. We are focused right now on those three areas and building the system to help us to continue to focus on student learning. This will be a process but as we align the written curriculum to the taught curriculum, we get closer to the target. When the written, taught, and tested are tightly coupled, the results will yield even greater student growth and achievement in learning.

It is the intent of this agreement to recognize the breadth and depth of this program as a foundation for students who matriculate at SUNY Cobleskill. A candidate from the Canton Area School District who:

- 1. Receives a Pennsylvania State high school diploma
- 2. Follows the Canton Area School District Agricultural Program curriculum, achieving an 85 average or higher in each course included in the above curriculum and meets all other SUNY Cobleskill admission requirements for their major
- 3. Has a written recommendation from the Canton Area School District Agricultural instructor

will be offered by SUNY College of Agriculture and Technology at Cobleskill:

- 1. Guaranteed admission into a Plant Science or Agricultural Business major
- 2. Will receive advanced standing credit with 3 semester hours for SUNY Cobleskill's course ORHT 105 Introduction to Horticulture
- 3. Will receive advanced standing credit with 3 semester hours for SUNY Cobleskill's course AGBU 100 Beginning Agricultural Business

The student must complete and file a SUNY Cobleskill Admissions Application according to instructions. The letter of recommendation from the Agricultural Instructor must accompany the application stating the student attends this institution, which has an articulation agreement with SUNY Cobleskill.

The effective date of this agreement is January 1, 2022, and will be reviewed for renewal, one year after signing, by the participating parties.

Persons not meeting these criteria have the option of applying to SUNY Cobleskill under regular admission procedure.
